## RANKING RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES


Outcome: I can rank the enjoyment of a variety of recreational activities.

During the lesson, students will move freely among recreational activities. Students should be encouraged to play at least three activities. Prior to the lesson, set up a Bike Rack with either a large whiteboard with all of the provided recreational activity listed or several pieces of paper with one activity per piece of paper. Establish protocol limiting the number of students at the Bike Rack to enhance efficiency.

After engaging in at least three activities, students move to the Bike Rack and rank the activities with one being their favorite, two the next favorite, and so on. This process should take less than a minute, then students return to activity.

At the end of the class, review the various rankings of the recreational activities. Everyone likes different activities, and activity choices are individual.
